NARRATIVE

On June 22nd, 2016 at 7:21 A.M. Officers with the Colorado Springs Police Department were dispatched to the area of Delta Drive and San Marcos Drive regarding a weapons display call. Information received was a white male subject was observed walking in the area carrying a beer in one hand and a handgun in his other hand. The first arriving Officer encountered the male in the parking lot and gave multiple verbal commands to the subject who refused the orders to drop his weapon. The male subject then pointed his weapon at the officer and fired in the officer's direction. The officer discharged his duty weapon and the male subject was struck and subsequently taken into custody. The male was transported to a local hospital due to his injury and was later pronounced deceased at the hospital.

The El Paso County Sheriffs Office respond and conducted an investigation into this Officer involved shooting incident, (EPSO Case Number 16-8393).

NARRATIVE

Officer Statement

On 06/22/16 at approximately 1306 hours, I, Officer S. Wren/4179 was dispatched along with Officer R. Lund-Taylor/2311 to a disturbance related call for service [REDACTED] at [REDACTED]. This call for service was later determined to be a theft. Information in the call screen from the reporting party/victim, Jessica [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was that her ex-boyfriend, Andrew [REDACTED] tried to lock her out and would not let her leave. The call screen also showed that Jessica believed Andrew was arrested on 06/21/16 and that Andrew also lives with his brother, Josiah Williams (DOB: 02/25/91). It was later learned Jessica also lived with Andrew and Josiah. Jessica also advised the call taker that her gun was missing and she believed Josiah had it. Jessica advised the call taker Josiah is [REDACTED] and uses heroin and methamphetamines. Jessica advised the call taker she does not know where Josiah is at currently but that her apartment was gone through, property was damaged, her gun was gone, and her chinchilla was killed. Upon arrival at approximately 1311 hours, Officer Lund-Taylor and I contacted Jessica who was in the office at the apartment complex, along with her mother (unknown name/DOB).

Officer Lund-Taylor began to speak with Jessica who advised officers of a disturbance occurring approximately two days ago. During this disturbance Jessica stated Andrew prevented her from leaving and took her phone from her. When asked why Jessica did not call during this incident she stated she just wanted to get away. Jessica stated she has been staying with her mom for the past couple days. Jessica stated she did not want officers contacting Andrew regarding this incident. When asked why Jessica called the police on 06/22/16 she stated it was

because she returned home to get some of her items approximately 10 minutes before she called police and realized her gun, a .380 pistol (see Officer Lund-Taylor's supplement for further description) was not at the apartment. Jessica stated the last time she saw the pistol it was in the residence on a book case.

After speaking with Jessica at the office, Officer Lund-Taylor and I went with her to [REDACTED] where she lives to see if any other property was missing. Jessica allowed officers into the residence; Officer Lund-Taylor and I along with Jessica's mom went with Jessica into the residence. Upon entering Jessica looked in a room which she stated was Josiah's room to see if any of her property was in there. Jessica stated Josiah and Andrew would occasionally use her laptop to watch movies. Jessica stated the window and screen in Josiah's room was open and off when she came home on 06/22/16. Jessica then went into her bedroom and stated the laptop (see Officer Lund-Taylor's supplement for further description) along with a gold cross necklace Jessica purchased for her mom was gone. Jessica did not say if any other items were missing.

At approximately this time, Sergeant J. Lewis/1614 requested for Officer Lund-Taylor to contact her. After Officer Lund-Taylor contacted Sergeant Lewis, he advised me, the theft incident involving the .380 may be related to an earlier incident (CFS 16273032/CSPD Case 16-24497/EPSO Case 16-8393) which was an officer involved shooting. It was later learned Josiah was the suspect in the officer involved shooting. I am unaware if the firearm Josiah had during the linked call for service is the same firearm taken from Jessica during our call for service.

At this time, Officer Lund-Taylor escorted Jessica and her mom to the office to speak with them and wait for detectives. I stayed at the apartment with Officer Lund-Taylor relieving me briefly so I could get items from my patrol vehicle. When I returned to the apartment, I remained at the doorway of the apartment. I did enter the apartment several times because one of the windows in a bedroom (Josiah's room) of the apartment was wide open and the screen was off. When I entered the apartment it was when I heard the blinds on the window moving and I wanted to ensure no one was entering through this window because I could not see the window from the front door. No one entered through the window and when I checked it was the wind moving the blinds in the room. After entering due to the blinds moving, I went back to the doorway. I also entered the apartment to open the same room's door. The door kept closing due to the wind. When I entered I opened the door, I then checked to make sure no one had entered the room. When I checked no one entered the room. After checking and opening the door, I went back to the doorway of the apartment and continued to provide scene security.

Officer M. Aoki/4892 relieved me at the doorway of the residence at approximately 1453 hours. At this time, I advised Officer Aoki I would be providing scene security at the back of the residence so if he heard the blinds moving or if the door closed there would not be a need for him to check on the room. I then left the doorway of the apartment and moved my car to the back of the apartment, providing scene security at the back of the apartment. I was relieved by Officer C. Rivera/1766 at approximately 1545. At this time I left the scene.

I was not actively involved in the officer involved shooting call for service. When Officer Lund-Taylor and I were dispatched to this call

for service we were not aware this call was related to the officer involved shooting call for service until Sergeant Lewis advised us.

Because the El Paso County Sheriff's Office was investigating the officer involved shooting, they advised Officer Lund-Taylor and me that they would be taking over the theft report because it was believed to be related to the officer involved shooting.

The call for service for this call 16273452 has been linked to call for service 16273032/CSPD Case 16-24497/EPSCO Case 16-8393.

The supplement is being completed under CSPD Case 16-24497 as an outside agency assist because EPSCO took over the theft report because it was believed to be related to the officer involved shooting.

NARRATIVE

OFFICER STATEMENT:

On Wednesday, 06-22-16 at approximately 0845 hours I, Officer **S.R. Acey 9594P / 3A03**, arrived at the Sand Creek substation in preparation for beginning my shift at 0900 hours. While I was in the employee parking lot, I was contacted by Sgt. **J. Lewis 1614P / 3P06**, who informed me that there had been an Officer involved shooting near Hancock Expy and Delta Dr. Sgt. Lewis then instructed me to start my shift immediately.

At approximately 0948 hours, I was dispatched to the intersection of Hancock Expy and Delta Dr, to assist with traffic control. Upon arrival, I contacted Sgt. Lewis, Sgt. **C. Rabideau 245D / 1X30** (CSPD Homicide Unit Supervisor) and Sgt. **C. Porter** (EPSO Homicide Unit Supervisor). I was then instructed to stop all southbound traffic on Hancock Expy and divert it onto Laramie Dr.

At approximately 0956 hours, I stopped all southbound traffic on Hancock Expy. This road closure is listed as "eastbound" on the call screen, # **16273032**, due to the fact that this section of Hancock Expy is laid out in a east-west direction. All traffic was diverted onto northbound Laramie Dr.

At approximately 1108 hours, a Colorado Springs Utilities truck arrived and set-up barricades and road closure signs at my location to assist me with traffic control.

At approximately 1203 hours, I re-opened all southbound lanes of Hancock Expy at Laramie Dr after being instructed to do so by Sgt. Lewis. A short time later, I returned to the Sand Creek substation and completed this supplemental report.

I had no further involvement in this investigation.

Initial Information

On 06/22/2016 at approximately 0735 hrs, I Officer Timothy Hayes 5109, responded to the area of Hancock Expressway and San Marcos Dr. to assist officers who were dispatched to a male walking with a handgun and a beer. I requested the CSPD Communications Center dispatch me by sending an MDC message once officers were on scene with the suspect.

While enroute to the scene I was advised by CSPD dispatch that shots were fired. I proceeded code 3 (lights and siren) to the scene and arrived a short time later.

Officer Statement

Upon arriving on scene I parked my vehicle facing west on Hancock expressway just south of Delta Dr. blocking the entrance to 7-11 (2555 Delta Dr.) I approached the scene where Officer Watson 287 and Officer Price 2316 were standing, on the northeast side of the parking lot. I observed a white sedan parked in the parking lot.

Officer Price informed me approximately 4 shots were fired and the area to the south needed to be checked to verify no civilians were injured. Officer Davis 4248 and I checked the area to the south to include the businesses on the south side of Hancock expressway. No damage was observed or personnel in the area.

I approached the scene again and informed Officer Price that nothing was found. I observed medical personnel load a white male into the rear of an ambulance. I proceeded to follow the AMR ambulance, code 3, to Memorial Central Hospital.

Upon arriving to the hospital I observed medical personnel open the rear doors to the ambulance and personnel inside were doing compressions on the white male. I proceeded inside the hospital where I stood outside of the trauma room due to the high volume of medical personnel working.

I was approached by **William [REDACTED]** who stated he was in the rear of the AMR ambulance and a member of Squad 11 Shift B of the Colorado Springs Fire Department. Rogers wanted to know the story behind the shooting and explained to me that when he arrived on scene he removed 1 Taser probe from the male's left hip. Rogers stated he only found one probe but could have pulled out a second when they cut his clothes off. Rogers stated he handed the probe to someone on scene before transporting.

A short time later I heard medical personnel in the emergency room state the male was deceased and pronounced a time of death of 0803 hrs. I stated with the deceased male in the trauma room until he was transported to a separate room. I stated with the deceased male until the El Paso County Deputy Coroner arrived on scene.

I later went back to the scene of Hancock/San Marcos and assisted with scene security and traffic control.

INITIATING INFORMATION

On 06/22/2016 at approximately 0830hrs, I (Sgt. Jennifer R. Lewis, 1614) arrived at work at the Sand Creek Division, which is located at 4125 Center Park Drive, for Shift I Patrol duties. As I entered the building, I made contact with Shift III Patrol Sergeant Korey Hutchison, 1104. I was advised there had been an "Officer Involved Shooting" in the area of Hancock Ave and Delta Drive.

Sgt. Hutchison explained that Commander Whittington, 496 was "Command" on scene and Sgt. F. Low, 29 had taken the Patrol Officer involved in the shooting to the Police Operation Center. This officer was later identified as Bill Watson, 287. Sergeant Detective Eric Anderson, 1386 was at Memorial Central, located at 1400 E. Boulder Street, with the suspect.

I immediately got into service and made contact with the "in-coming" 0900hrs officers in the parking lot. I spoke with Officer Scott Acey, 9594 and Officer Eric Reed, 1714 and advised them to get into service.

ROUTE TAKEN TO HANCOCK AVE and DELTA RD.

As I loaded up my marked patrol vehicle (#2629), I advised dispatched that I was in service. Dispatch sent me the call over the radio and I responded to Hancock Ave and Delta Rd.

I exited the back parking lot of the Sand Creek Division and made a right turn onto Center Park Drive. I continued east on Center Park Drive until I came to the "T" intersection of Center Park Drive and Murray Blvd. I made a right turn on Murray Blvd, heading south. At the next major intersection of Murray Blvd and Chelton Road, I stopped at the stop sign and made a right turn onto Chelton Road.

I then travelled west on Chelton Road to the next intersection of Chelton Road and Academy Blvd. I made a left turn onto Academy Blvd and then proceeded south on Academy Blvd until I came to the intersection of Academy Blvd and Hancock Ave.

At Academy Blvd and Hancock Ave, I made a right turn onto Hancock Ave and proceeded west until I came to the intersection of Hancock Ave and Delta Drive.

ARRIVAL ON SCENE

As I came up on the scene, I parked my vehicle in the left turn lane of Hancock Ave. The crime scene tape was blocking any vehicle traffic from entering the intersection between Hancock Ave and Delta Road to

the north and Delta Drive and San Marcos Road to the south.

I observed five people dressed in business attire, who I was not familiar with at this point. I was later introduced to these people and discovered this the Investigation Unit from El Paso County Sherriff's Department (EPSO).

My main function on this scene was to make sure there was enough Patrol officers and Community Service Officers (CSO's) to maintain a secured crime scene perimeter, safe traffic control points, and to facilitate information between the patrol officers and EPSO detectives.

My point of contact was EPSO Sergeant Cliff Porter.

OBSERVATION OF SCENE

One of my first contacts on scene was with Officer E. Davis, 4248 who was assigned to stop traffic from travelling northbound on Delta Drive from Hancock Ave. Officer Davis explained the shooting had occureed in the parking lot of the small strip mall, located at 2500 block of Delta Drive.

I observed the strip mall consisted of a 7-11 store, Soul Food, Barber Shop, and D&S Liquors. Then I observed a large white car parked in a parking stall. The front of this vehicle was facing west. There was a marked patrol vehicle (#1) just to the north of the vehicle on the passenger side, parked at an angel. There there were two other CSPD cruisers parked at an angel to the cruiser #1. I did not approach the vehicles because the EPSO was in command of the scene.

Officer Carter, 2881 had arrived on scene about the same time I had arrived and knew Officer Carter had remained on shift past his "off time" to assist in the call. He had come back to the scene to transport a citizen to the POC. I instructed Officer Carter to complete his transport and then head back to the Sand Creek Division to call off shift.

Officer Gilman and I made contact about 10 minutes after my arrival and he stated he had been contacted by a truck driver who believed his vehicle had been hit by a bullet when the shooting occurred. Since the investigation was being conducted by EPSO, I notified Sgt. Porter of the information and he had one of his detectives contact Officer Gilman and the truck driver.

- CSO Simpson, 5063 position his marked CSO cruiser at Delta Road and San Marcos street to prevent south bound traffic from continuing on Delta Road at San Marcos Street
- CSO S. Garcia, 624 to the north of D&S Liquor to prevent walking traffic entering the liquor store.
- Officer Eric Davis, secured the intersection of Delta Drive and Hancock Ave on the northside.
- Officer J. INITIATING INFORMATION

On the morning of 06/22/2016, I, Officer A. Carey, 4156, was working patrol at the Sand Creek Division of the Colorado Springs Police Department. At approximately 0720 hours I overheard Officer W. Watson, 287, and other officers being dispatched to the area of Delta Dr and San Marcos Dr to investigate a weapons brandishing call for service.

At approximately 0735 hours, I heard Officer Watson air over the radio that he was in contact with a male who had a gun and needed a code one. Officer Watson aired his location at Hancock Expressway and Delta Drive. I had been dispatched to a different call for service in a different area, but disregarded my call and began responding toward Officer Watson's location from the area of North Circle Drive and East Platte Avenue.

Approximately 20 seconds later, Officer E. Price, 2316, who was also on Officer Watson's call, aired over the radio that shots had been fired and a suspect was down. Officers on scene called for medical personnel to respond and requested additional officers respond to the area to assist in securing the crime scene.

OFFICER STATEMENT

I arrived on scene at approximately 0740 hours. Upon arriving, I parked my marked cruiser in the east parking lot of a gas station at 2555 Hancock Expressway, which was located on the northwest corner of the intersection of Hancock Expressway and Delta Drive. When I arrived in the area, I observed several officers and medical personnel were in the parking lot located in the 2500 block of Delta Drive, which was across the street from where I parked my cruiser. I observed other officers in the area were beginning to block roadways and parking lots in the area in an attempt to secure the scene. I did not respond to the area where medical personnel were and I did not see specifically what they were doing in this area, although I believed they were attending to the gunshot victim.

I walked to the parking lot in the 2500 block of Delta Drive, specifically toward the 7-11 at 2555 Delta Drive. I observed there were four vehicles parked in front of the 7-11. I observed one of the vehicles was a black Subaru Forester, one of the vehicles was a red Ford Taurus bearing Colorado license plate [REDACTED], one of the vehicles was a silver Honda sedan, and the other vehicle was a dark colored Nissan Titan bearing Colorado license plate [REDACTED]. I entered the 7-11 store and observed there were three customers inside and one clerk. I informed the parties inside the 7-11 that the area was an active crime scene and they would be required to remain inside the store for the time being.

I then identified all parties inside the 7-11. The first of the three customers was identified as Brenda [REDACTED] Ms. [REDACTED] stated she had arrived at the 7-11 at approximately 0740 hours. Ms. [REDACTED] stated when she arrived at the 7-11, she observed officers and medical personnel were already in the area. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she knew nothing of the shooting.

The next customer was identified as Morin [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] stated he also had arrived on scene after officers and medical personnel were already there. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he knew nothing about the shooting.

The third customer was identified as Jose [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] spoke no English, but through my limited knowledge of the Spanish language, I was able to communicate with him that he had not been present during the shooting, and had no information to provide.

I then contacted the clerk working at the 7-11, who was identified as Balvir [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] also spoke very little English. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he knew anything about the shooting in the parking lot and he stated he had not seen or heard anything related to the shooting. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he had been working behind the front counter all morning and he stated he had been behind the front counter for approximately the past 20 minutes. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if anybody unusual or suspicious had entered the store in the past 20 minutes and he stated no.

I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if the store was equipped with video cameras for the parking lots and he did not seem to understand my question. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] to show me where the surveillance system was setup and he walked me into a back office area. Mr. [REDACTED] showed me a computer monitor, which was actively showing three camera views, all of which were interior store camera views. I again asked Mr. [REDACTED] if there were any exterior cameras for the parking lot and he implied that the parking lot cameras were broken. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he could contact a store manager or owner to respond to the scene to assist me with surveillance camera issues. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he would do so.

I walked back to the front of the store where the three customers remained. I looked through the front windows of the store and observed the four vehicles which I had observed approaching the scene. At this time, I observed a male party was sitting inside of the Nissan Titan pickup truck. I exited the store and contacted the male party at the truck. The male identified himself to me as Landen [REDACTED]. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he had been in his truck the whole time and he stated he had. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he had been present for the shooting and he stated he had observed the entire incident. I instructed Mr. [REDACTED] to exit his vehicle and then obtained a statement from him.

LANDEN [REDACTED] STATEMENT

Mr. [REDACTED] stated he had arrived at the 7-11 at 0735 hours. Mr. [REDACTED] stated as he was pulling into the 7-11 parking lot off of Hancock Expressway, he observed a black Colorado Springs Police Department cruiser turning northbound onto Delta Drive off of Hancock Expressway. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he parked his truck in front of the 7-11 and observed the black police car he had observed driving northbound on Delta Drive, had pulled into the parking lot to the north of him.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated he exited his vehicle and began walking toward the 7-11. Mr. [REDACTED] stated as he exited his vehicle, he observed the officer from the black cruiser was in contact with a male party to the north of his location in the parking lot. overhead lights on and the officer initially seemed calm while he was contacting the male party. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he observed the male party was holding what appeared to be a handgun in one of his hands and the officer was calmly telling him to put the gun down. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he heard the officer tell the male party to drop the gun several times, but could not remember specifically how many.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated the male party appeared to make a downward motion with the hand holding the gun as if he was going to put the gun down, but then quickly lifted the hand back up. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he thought he observed the male party manipulating the handgun as if placing a magazine in it and racking the slide. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he thought he heard a metallic noise that was consistent with these manipulations. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he continued hearing the officer give the male party commands to drop the gun. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he believed he heard or saw the male party fire his weapon one or two times after this. Mr. [REDACTED] was unsure if the male party had fired the weapon in the officer's direction or up in the air or if the suspect had even fired the weapon. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he had partially hidden behind his pickup truck during this incident so his line of sight was partially obscured for some of it.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated after he heard what he believed to be a shot fired from the suspect's gun, he heard four shots being fired from the officer's direction. Mr. [REDACTED] stated at this time, he was completely hidden behind his truck and did not clearly observe the shots being fired. Mr. [REDACTED] stated after the shots were fired, he again looked toward the north in the parking lot from behind his truck and observed the male party lying on the ground as if he had been shot. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he observed an additional officer arrive in the area a short time later. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he did not remain at his location, but went inside the 7-11. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he had remained on scene because the area had been taped off and he was not able to leave.

video on my cell phone of it, do you want to see it?" I informed Mr. [REDACTED] that I would like to see the video and he retrieved his smart phone from inside of his pickup truck. Mr. [REDACTED] accessed a video on his phone that appeared to be of this incident. I observed the video appeared to be taken from behind Mr. [REDACTED] pickup truck and I observed the video captured Officer Watson's Colorado Springs Police Department cruiser, which was in the same location in the video as it still was.

In the video, I observed Officer Watson standing behind cover on the driver's side of his cruiser. I observed the suspect was approximately ten yards to the southwest of Officer Watson. I could not clearly observe the suspect's hands from the video on Mr. [REDACTED] phone. In the video, I clearly heard Officer Watson tell the suspect to drop the gun several times. I observed the suspect made several furtive movements and made several moves toward Officer Watson's location. I then observed Officer Watson fired several shots at the suspect. The video moved away from Officer Watson's location at approximately the time the shots were being fired; however, the camera moved away from at this point as Mr. [REDACTED] took cover. Almost immediately after the shots were fired the camera lifted back up and I observed the suspect was lying on the ground.

I requested Mr. [REDACTED] to email and text this video to my department issued phone so that a record remained of it in case Mr. [REDACTED] deleted it from his phone or stopped being cooperative at a future time. Mr. [REDACTED] agreed to send me the videos and did so. I then instructed Mr. [REDACTED] to enter the 7-11 with the other customers and to remain there for the time being.

I walked back to the parking lot at 2555 Hancock Expressway and contacted the command staff and El Paso County Sheriff's Office (EPSO) Detectives, who were investigating this incident. I informed them I had contacted a witness to the incident who had recorded it on his cell phone. An EPSO Detective accompanied me back to the 7-11 and contacted Mr. [REDACTED]. The detective viewed the cell phone video and also requested Mr. [REDACTED] to send him the video. The detective requested Mr. [REDACTED] respond to the Police Operations Center to conduct an interview and Mr. [REDACTED] agreed. A short time later, Officer R. Carter, 2881, responded to my location and transported Mr. [REDACTED] to the Police Operations Center.

EPSO Detectives verified this information with the customers and released them from the scene a short time later. EPSO Detectives informed me that their information technology crew was going to respond to the 7-11 in an attempt to retrieve any video surveillance that might have been stored at a remote location. I was informed that I was no longer needed as scene security at the 7-11.

I responded back to the parking lot at 2555 Hancock Expressway. I relieved Officer N. Buckner, 4896, who was providing scene security in the east parking lot at this location. I remained at this location in a scene security capacity until I was relieved by Community Service Officer (CSO) M. Ryan, 445, at approximately 1100 hours.

After I was relieved, I responded to the Sand Creek Substation and made a DVD copy of the video from the incident. After ensuring that the video had properly transferred to DVD, I deleted the video off of my department issued phone. I placed the DVD into evidence at the Sand Creek Substation.

NARRATIVE

On 6/22/16, at about 0735 hours, while on an unrelated call for service, I heard Officer Watson/287 request a "Code 1" and broadcast he was in contact with a man with a gun in his hand. I diverted from my call and drove towards Officer Watson, who was in the area of Delta Drive and Hancock Expressway. Moments later, I heard a follow-up broadcast that shots had been fired.

The scene was secure prior to my arrival and medical personnel were still on scene. I created an inner perimeter with crime scene tape as directed by Commander Whittington/496. I was told there might have been stray rounds so I searched an area southward that I estimated to be within the possible trajectories. I was told that officers had already searched the parking lot and buildings southeast of the intersection so I searched the signage at southeast corner. I then searched the street itself (Delta Drive) southward and north facing surfaces within the presumed trajectory as far south and including the premises at Schmidt Construction Company (2635 Delta Drive). I found nothing of interest in my search south of Hancock Academy but while on the premises of Schmidt Construction, I was contacted by an unknown employee who said he heard a truck driver named "Clyde" report over the CB radio that a shooting had just occurred and that Clyde thought his truck might have been hit. I contacted management personnel and arranged a meeting between Clyde and EPSO personnel.

I returned to the scene and found what appeared to be a bullet impact on a large steel sign post on the street corner in front of 7-11 (2555 Delta Dr.). The impact did not penetrate the steel but left markings that were suggestive of a ricochet trajectory to the south by southeast of the steel post. I alerted an unknown EPSO deputy who was working with a Metro Crime Lab tech of my findings.

Blocking Delta Drive northbound on the south side of Hancock Academy until the scene was released was the extent of my further involvement. I held that post without incident.

Ms. [REDACTED] said once she learned that Andrew had been arrested and was in jail she decided to come to the apartment to retrieve some of her items, and try to move out of the apartment. Ms. [REDACTED] said once she arrived at the apartment, and went inside the apartment and it was in disarray. Ms. [REDACTED] said that she then went into her bedroom to retrieve her black Hi Point 380 from her bookshelf which she had bought at [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] said once she entered her bedroom, her room had appeared to have been rummaged through. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was unable to find her gun, or any of the 380 rounds that were also on the bookshelf. Ms. [REDACTED] said the last time she seen the gun was on 06/20/16 at approximately 1400 hours. Ms. [REDACTED] said after she was unable to locate her gun she decided to call the police, because she was afraid that her room mate Josiah Shane Williams unk DOB, may have taken it. Ms. [REDACTED] said that her room mate is [REDACTED], and for the past couple days he had believed people had been after him. Ms. [REDACTED] also said that her Hp computer was taken, along with some random gold jewelry.

Officer Statement:

Once Ms. [REDACTED] had looked through her bedroom, I asked her to walk around the rest of the apartment, and see if anything was missing. Ms. [REDACTED] then walked into Mr. Williams bedroom, and I observed that the ground floor window was open and laying on the mattress was a silver in color 380 round, and the room was in disarray. Ms. [REDACTED] then walked out of the room and headed towards the living room. As we walked down the hallway I observed another silver in color 380 round laying on the floor. While Ms. [REDACTED] was looking in the living room I also observed a silver in color round sitting on the bar ledge in the

kitchen. At that point I asked Ms. [REDACTED] Josiah's description and she said he was a white male with dirty blond hair, and very pale. At that point I believed Josiah may have been the suspect involved from the earlier incident involving an Officer involved shooting (EPSO 16-8393). At that point Sgt. Lewis called me on my department cell phone and asked me to confirm Josiah's middle name which was Shane. Sgt. Lewis then told me to stand by while she made contact with Detectives. At that point I asked Ms. [REDACTED] and her mother [REDACTED] to go with me to the main office, and I had Officer Wren stay in the apartment, to secure it due to the windows being open and you could not see them from the front door. I then escorted Ms. [REDACTED] to the office. Once at the office I received a phone call from Sgt. Lewis who stated to secure the apartment, and EPSO Detectives along with Detectives from our agency were en route to me, because my call for service was related to the earlier incident.

While waiting for detectives to arrive Ms. [REDACTED] cell phone was going off, and she started to asked me questions. Ms. [REDACTED] asked if Josiah was the one killed this morning, because a cousin of her's was saying it was. I then told her I could not confirm that at this time. A short time later Detective Somoksy arrived on scene, and I briefed him on what had taken place so far with my investigation. While discussing the incident with Detective Somosky other Detectives arrived on scene and took over the investigation. Detectives advised me to supplement the original case (EPSO 16-8393), and they would handle everything from my original call of the stolen gun.

NARRATIVE

Sergeant Statement:

On Wednesday June 22, 2016 at approximately 7:35 AM I, Sergeant Eric K. Anderson 1386D, was informed of an officer involved shooting which was taking place in the area of Delta Dr and South Hancock Expressway. Once I was given the information I gathered my work equipment and responded to the scene in my department issued detective vehicle. I responded by traveling west on Chelton to Delta Dr and then south on Delta Dr to the scene. When I arrived I parked my vehicle outside of the perimeter tape officers had already put up and contacted Commander Whittington on scene to determine what assistance was needed.

I noted that as I was contacting Commander Whittington that the AMR crew was loading a patient into the back of the ambulance. After contacting Commander Whittington I was asked to get in the ambulance and ride in the back with the suspect who had been shot. I would note that I arrived on scene at approximately 7:45 AM. As I entered the rear of the ambulance I observed a white male suspect wearing gray underwear on the gurney with his right hand handcuffed to the gurney. I listened as the firefighter was communicating with others in the back of the ambulance and informed them the suspect had a lower left abdomen entrance wound with no exit wound.

Prior to leaving the scene of the shooting I was provided with a Colorado ID card belonging to the suspect. The ID listed the suspect as:

Josiah Shane Williams

Colorado ID card # [REDACTED]

This ID card remained in my possession until the detective from the Sheriff's Office arrived at the hospital. I provided the EPSO Detective with the suspects ID card at that time.

At approximately 7:50 AM the rear doors of the ambulance were secured and the ambulance left the scene with lights and siren activated en route to Memorial Central Hospital. While en route the ambulance was followed by a CSPD officer who was also operating his marked police vehicle in an emergent mode with the overhead lights and sirens activated.

ambulance. At one point during the trip I was asked to hold a piece of gauze over the suspects left mid arm area. This was due to the medical people attempting an IV and not being able to get the IV started. During the trip to the hospital the suspect was unconscious and made no statements at any time to anyone in the rear of the ambulance.

At approximately 7:55 AM we arrived in the ambulance bay of Memorial Central hospital. I noted that as we were exiting the ambulance the medical personnel had started chest compressions on the suspect. Upon exiting the ambulance medical personnel moved the suspect into a trauma room at the hospital with medical personnel standing by. I remained inside the trauma room the entire time with the suspect until I was eventually relieved by CSPD Detective Somosky.

As the medical personnel worked on the victim at approximately 8:03 AM Dr. Paul Re kard, the trauma surgeon for the hospital, asked that all activity stop. after a brief pause Dr. Re kard pronounced the suspend dead at 8:03 AM.

During the attempts to keep the suspect alive doctors had cut the suspects chest open. At approximately 8:13 AM I observed as Doctor Brian Leininger staple the incision closed on the suspects chest.

During the entire trip from the scene of the shooting until we reached the hospital the suspect remained handcuffed to the gurney dressed in only his gray underwear. The suspect remained unconscious and unresponsive the entire time I was with the suspect. At no time did the suspect make or attempt to make any statements.

Officer Hayes and I checked the area and did not locate any additional damage or injured personnel.

I then assisted with perimeter security of the scene. I was released at approximately 1247 hours after the scene was processed and the on scene investigation was completed.

At this time I arrived at Memorial Central Hospital located at 1400 East Boulder Street and entered into the Emergency Department via the ambulance bay. After entering into the Emergency Department, I proceeded to care unit #1, resuscitation room #1 where I located **Colorado Springs Police Department Commander T. Eells/126, Sand Creek Division Investigations Sergeant E. Anderson/1386, and Sand Creek Division Shift 1 Patrol Officer T. Hayes/5109P** near the doorway to resuscitation room #1.

In the center of the room, lying on his back on a hospital gurney was a deceased white male who was covered from his lower torso to his feet with a white hospital sheet and appeared to be undressed from the portions of his body and skin that I was able to see not covered by the hospital blanket. During my observations of the deceased white male I noted that he appeared to be between the ages of 20 and 24 years of age with brown colored hair and brown colored facial hair. The deceased was intubated and I could see a green colored ambulance backboard separating his body from the hospital bed linens.

Also at this time, **El Paso County Sheriff's Office Detective A. Thompson/# 02060** arrived at resuscitation room #1. Detective Thompson advised that he was the assigned detective from the El Paso County Sheriff's Office who would be assigned to the suspect role as part of the Deadly Force Investigation Team, or DFIT, for this investigation. I introduced myself to Detective Thompson and explained that I would act as his liaison for the Colorado Springs Police Department throughout the duration of the investigation. Detective Thompson and I exchanged business cards and contact information and then received a briefing from Commander Eells.

off during emergency medical intervention on scene by the American Medical Response (AMR) ambulance personnel. Commander Eells explained that **Sergeant Anderson** had ridden in the ambulance with the deceased from the scene to the hospital. Commander Eells said that numerous emergency personnel and trauma surgeons attempted to provide emergency medical intervention for the deceased, but ultimately **pronounced his time of death at 0803 hours.**

Officer Hayes then provided Detective Thompson and me a Colorado driver's license for a subject identified as **Josiah Shane Williams, DOB 02/25/1991.** I noted that the Colorado driver's license number was [REDACTED] and listed an address of [REDACTED]. I compared the likeness of the digital photograph from the Colorado driver's license for Josiah Williams to the face of the deceased person laying on the hospital gurney nearby and determined that the likeness matched. I then updated Sergeant Rabideau on the information of the tentative identification of the deceased subject via text message using department-issued cellular phone. I further noted on the Colorado driver's license that Josiah Williams was described as a white male, 5'8" tall, 135 lbs. with brown hair and blue eyes.

Commander Eells explained that officers and detectives were still trying to determine if the deceased had been tased by responding officers prior to the exchange of gunfire. Sergeant Anderson advised that, while he did not observe a Taser probe attached to the deceased, he did receive information from a Colorado Springs Fire Department paramedic who reported seeing a probe in the deceased's left hip. Sergeant Anderson said at this time it is unknown where the Taser probe was located, but speculated that it could still be located on scene. Sergeant Anderson said that throughout the ambulance ride from the scene to the hospital, he noted that the deceased's right hand was handcuffed to the hospital gurney in the same condition that the deceased's body was in as we spoke and the deceased was dressed in his underwear and he did not see a Taser probe attached to the underwear or the deceased's body throughout the trip from the scene.

After receiving the briefing from Commander Eells and Sergeant Anderson, Detective Thompson notified the El Paso County, Colorado Coroner's Office on-call deputy coroner via telephone and learned that the assigned deputy

coroner for the day on-call was **Deputy Coroner Rob Stevenson**. Commander Eells and Sergeant Anderson explained that Officer T. Hayes would remain at the hospital with Detective Thompson and me and provide any assistance from the Patrol Bureau that the investigation required.

At 0832 hours

Both Commander Eells and Sergeant Anderson departed the Emergency Department.

Officer Hayes said that he had identified the Colorado Springs Fire Department paramedic who had reported seeing a Taser probe attached to the deceased's body as **Firefighter Paramedic William Rogers** and the Taser probe was reportedly removed from the deceased's left hip and handed to an officer on scene. Officer Hayes explained at this time, the officer who was handed the Taser probe was unknown to him. Officer Hayes said that in addition to the Taser probe, Firefighter Paramedic Rogers also reported seeing multiple hypodermic syringe sites consistent with a subject who used intravenous narcotics.

At 0855 hours

Detective Thompson began documenting the deceased's body with digital photographs. I assisted Detective Thompson by positioning a forensic scale in the field of view for his digital photographs. I noted that Detective Thompson completed documenting the deceased's body with digital photographs at 0910 hours.

While Detective Thompson was documenting the deceased's body with digital photographs, I noted that on the left side lower torso of the deceased's body, below the rib cage, there appeared to be a puncture type wound with what appeared to be the deceased's intestines beginning to be forced out of the void. At almost the same level on the right side lower torso of the deceased's body, I observed a defect bruise and abrasion consistent with having possibly been caused by the projectile that had entered into the previously mentioned puncture wound, striking that part of the deceased's body and coming to rest inside his body cavity.

After completing documenting the deceased's body with digital photographs, Detective Thompson advised Emergency Department nurse **RN J. Whitlock** that the hospital staff could move the body out of the resuscitation room in order to prepare the room for possible other incoming trauma patients. Detective Thompson and I walked with RN Whitlock as he moved the rolling hospital gurney and the deceased's body from resuscitation room #1 across the hall to consult room #2 at 0912 hours. It should be noted that consult room #2 is also located within the Emergency Department within care unit # 1.

At this time, El Paso County, Colorado Deputy Coroner Rob Stevenson arrived within the Emergency Department of Memorial Central Hospital. Deputy Coroner Stevenson advised he would be transporting the deceased directly from the hospital to the coroner's office for storage until the scheduled autopsy exam for the next day. reported having purchased a High Point brand, .380 semi-automatic handgun from [REDACTED] earlier in June 2016 and upon returning to the apartment, determined that both the handgun and its associated paperwork were missing from its location where she normally stored it.

Officer Taylor advised after arriving on scene along with Colorado Springs Police Department **Officer S. Wren/4179P**, they immediately secured the apartment, preventing anyone from entering or exiting until investigators arrived on scene. Officer Taylor explained that during his walk-around of the apartment, which is located on the first floor of the building, he determined that there were multiple windows on the west side of the building for Apartment [REDACTED] that were open. the suspects as being strung out on drugs and both being wanted possibly out of Douglas County, Colorado. In addition to the handgun, the reporting party reported between 20 and 30 rounds of ammunition for the firearm and she did not know the current location or storage location of the firearm. The reporting party requested that she remain anonymous and provided a description of both suspects to the dispatcher.

I noted that Colorado Springs Police Department **Officers J. Butcher, Unit # 3A58, A. Rogers, Unit #3A68, Robert Allen, Unit 3A98 and Sergeant Robert Wilson, Unit #3P15** were dispatched to the apartment and reported on the call screen that they were in contact with two subjects. ██████████. Mr. ██████████ said that his vehicle, a white colored Cadillac Escalade, was in the news media footage and appeared to have been damaged by gunfire and was being examined by officers. I advised Mr. Simmons that the El Paso County Sheriff's Office, by Colorado law, was the lead agency conducting the investigation involving the officer involved shooting and I would find out the extent of the investigation, to include the relevance to his vehicle, and call him back with an update immediately.

I remained outside the apartment near the front door with Officer Aoki while El Paso County Sheriff's Office Detectives conducted the execution of the search warrant to provide any additional assistance or information they required. I noted that the sheriff's office completed the execution of the search warrant at 1754 hours and, upon completion, exited the residence, secured all the windows and doors and made sure they were locked before securing the front door behind them. Dr. Kelly requested to examine the clothes worn by the deceased at the time of the officer involved shooting. NOTIFICATION:

8:00 a.m.

I, Detective J. Isham, while at work on the second floor of the Police Operations Center was notified by Sgt. Reed of an officer involved shooting regarding one of the Colorado Springs Police Department patrol officers. Sgt. Rabideau stated that an officer had discharged his weapon near the area of 2535 Delta Drive in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Sgt. Rabideau advised that since a CSPD officer had discharged his weapon that the El Paso County Sheriff's Department would be responding with a Deadly Force Investigation Team (DFIT). Sgt. Rabideau requested that I respond to the scene and be the CSPD scene liaison for the DFIT team.

Before leaving the Police Operations Center I then printed out a hard copy of call screen #16273032 and placed it in my notes. While looking over the call screen I noted that the address listed was 2535 Delta Drive and this call for service was initiated at approximately 7:21 a.m. on this date. I then prepared for this call and departed the Police Operations Center on this date at 8:17 a.m.

ARRIVAL ON SCENE:

06/22/16 (Wednesday)
8:21 a.m.

I arrived on scene and parked my unmarked police vehicle on the northwest corner of the intersection of Delta Drive and Hancock. I noticed several marked police cruisers and yellow crime scene tape had been strung protecting the scene.

After arriving I contacted CSPD Officer Blackburn and I asked him if he knew if any other officers involved in this call for service were still on scene. Officer Blackburn then motioned to three marked police cars in the parking lot of the liquor store located at 2539 Delta Drive and stated that

Officer Price and Officer Yelvington were involved with this call for service from his understanding and were still on scene.

At this point I was contacted by Commander Wilson and I advised Commander Wilson that two officers possibly involved in this situation were still on scene and I was going to attempt to separate these officers and make them available for any interviews that the El Paso County Sheriff's Department would like to conduct with them.

I called the Colorado Springs Police Department, Emergency Call Center, and requested all 911 calls related to this call for service. The Communications Center supervisor stated she would pull these 911 calls and email them to me as soon as she had them.

I was notified by Commander Wilson that there was an eyewitness to this incident and that this eyewitness had possibly videotaped some of the call for service and was directed to have this eyewitness transported to the Police Operations Center or to the Sheriff's Department for an interview. I then contacted CSPD dispatch via telephone and had them dispatch a CSPD patrol officer to transport the civilian eyewitness to the El Paso County Sheriff's Department for an interview regarding this incident.

the Faro scanner from CSI Quick and traveled back and parked my vehicle again on the northwest corner of Hancock and Delta and provided the Faro scanner to CSI Weise who was on scene processing this officer involved shooting incident.

It should be noted that while crime scene investigators and detectives with the El Paso County Sheriff's office were processing the scene I remained in the parking lot located on the northwest corner and did not locate or retrieve any physical evidence related to this.

06/22/16 (Wednesday)

10:44 a.m.

I met with Sgt. Rabideau in his unmarked police vehicle. Sgt. Rabideau provided the possible suspect's name in this incident (deceased) as **Josiah Shane Williams** and provided his DOB as 02/05/91. Sgt. Rabideau stated he had received this information from Detective Somosky and again confirmed that the victim officer from CSPD who had discharged his handgun was identified as **William Watson**.

I was advised by Sgt. Rabideau to contact the Colorado Springs Police Department Call Center and advise them of the updated address to this call for service. as she started processing the vehicles that were located on scene. It should be noted that these three vehicles were marked CSPD police cruisers.

Detective Monteville then advised this detective that CSPD Officer Price had secured the suspect's handgun and it was located in the trunk of his vehicle. Upon inspection of this weapon Detective Monteville was unable to lock the slide to the rear and make the weapon secure. It should be noted that I then put on a new unused pair of latex gloves and located the High Point .380 caliber handgun in the trunk.

I did lock the slide to the rear noting that one live round was in the chamber and that there were three more live rounds in the magazine of this handgun. After I cleared the handgun and made it safe I then returned the weapon, as well as the ammunition, to CSI Weise who then photographed the weapon and took custody of it before it was placed into Evidence.

It should be noted that I did not collect any other items of physical evidence during the processing of this scene and just stood by as the CSPD liaison detective.

It should be noted after clearing this scene I was contacted by Detective Monteville who stated she and several other detectives were returning to the scene after it had been released in an attempt to locate any spent or fired cartridge casings from the suspect weapon and any projectiles from his weapon. It should be noted I did respond and checked several addresses and locations and could not locate any projectile or bullet defects to any property surrounding this crime scene.

CONTACT WITH DETECTIVE MONTEVILLE (EPSO) :

I learned from Detective Monteville who was the lead investigator for the El Paso County Sheriff's Department regarding this incident that the interview with CSPD Officer William Watson would be conducted on Friday, June 24th, at 9:00 a.m. at the Office of the Sheriff (OTS). I would note that I did monitor this interview with Officer Watson from a separate monitoring room and was not physically present in the interview room during this interview.
