SUSPECT/ARRESTEE STATUS

INITIAL INFORMATION

On 10-13-2016, at approximately 1827 hours, Officers Balka 3167, Frabbiele 4639, Speight 3344, Walker 5733 and 1 Officer W. Woodworth 2851, were dispatched to 1207 S. Nevada Ave (Discount Exhaust Works), in reference to a reported disturbance. Initial information from dispatch was that a male was outside of this location with a machete and was not allowing staff to leave.

On arrival Officers contacted four males on the south side of the business these males where detain and identified. The Reporting Party Alexander [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Jimmy [REDACTED] where two of the males contacted and initially detained. The other two males were identified as Dorion Thompson DOB [REDACTED] and Noah McCulley DOB [REDACTED]. Mr. Thompson was identified by the [REDACTED] as the male with the machete but did not have the weapon in his possession on contact. Alex stated that he had walked east of the business down an alley to other parties next to a white sedan prior to Officers arriving.

I responded to this location which is in front of the old KOA camp ground located at 1209 S. Nevada Ave. Here I contacted Natasha Harvey DOB [REDACTED] and Andi Van Gogh DOB [REDACTED], who advised they were moving property to the back of the KOA campground when they were confronted by the [REDACTED] who told them that they were trespassing on their property. Ms. Gogh stated she informed the [REDACTED] that she was told they could be there to move Ms. Harvey's property. Ms. Gogh stated when they did not move their property the [REDACTED] began throwing their property and shoved her and Ms. Harvey causing Ms. Harvey to fall to the ground scrapping her knee. Ms. Gogh stated this is when Mr. Thompson and Mr. McCulley responded to defend them.

A Camillus Carnivore X approximate 1' machete with brown handle in black sheath was found in a box near Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey.

The [REDACTED] advised that Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey were trespassing on their property and asked them to leave. The [REDACTED] stated that when the females would not move their property they [REDACTED] began moving the property by sliding it, when Ms. Harvey jumped on the back of Jimmy causing Alexander to pull her off and fell to the ground. The [REDACTED] stated at this time they were confronted by Mr. Thompson who had the machete in a sheath on his right leg and had his hand on the handle slightly exposing the blade portion. Alexander stated Mr. Thompson stated "I know you're not hitting these white woman". The [REDACTED] stated Mr. Thompson was being belligerent stated he was going to own their business and burn everything down but did not pull the machete out or make threats to harm them but they did not feel safe so called 911.

Mr. Thompson was uncooperative with Officer's and racially volatile. Mr. Thompson did not provide details relating to the incident. Mr. McCulley stated he heard arguing and observed the [REDACTED] Ms. Gogh and Ms.

NARRATIVE

INITIAL INFORMATION:

On 10/13/16 (Thursday) at 18:28 hours, Officer W. Woodworth/2851 and I (Officer R. Balka/3167...2A55) were dispatched to 1207 S. Nevada Avenue; Discount Exhaust Works, to investigate a disturbance in progress involving a machete.

OFFICER STATEMENT:

Officer Woodworth and I arrived on scene simultaneously at 18:33 hours. I observed approximately 4 people walking eastbound from south of the business. Upon contact, 1 person attempted to avoid contact with officers. The suspect, later identified as **Doriun Thompson** [REDACTED], was highly antagonistic and did not comply with officer commands. The other 3 people were very helpful with officers. Officer Woodworth handcuffed Mr. Thompson.

SUSPECT #1 INFORMATION/STATEMENT:

Doriun Thompson [REDACTED]
Transient

Mr. Thompson continued to yell loudly. He sounded racially explosive. I did not recover a machete from his person. Mr. Thompson would not acknowledge the presence of a possible weapon in the area. Mr. Thompson continued to yell loudly. I placed him in the rear seat of my marked patrol vehicle to keep him from inciting others on scene.

A records check revealed Mr. Thompson had an active warrant in Nebraska [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] There was "no extradition" outside the state of Nebraska for the warrant.

VICTIM #2 INFORMATION/STATEMENT:

Alexander [REDACTED]

Mr. [REDACTED] stated the event occurred at approximately 6:15 PM when he and [REDACTED] **Jimmy** [REDACTED] returned a rental truck to their property. Mr. [REDACTED] stated there was personal [transient] property in their path as they traveled on their private property. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he and his father began moving the transient property when a white female (with red hair) violently jumped on [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he grabbed the female to remove her from [REDACTED]. A larger female joined the fray.

Mr. Boatright stated Suspect #1 and Suspect #2 [Noah McCulley ██████████] aggressively approached from the wooded KOA area nearby. Mr. ██████████ recalled Suspect #1 exclaimed "I know you just didn't touch those white women!" Mr. ██████████ said Suspect #1 "took out a machete!" He later clarified that Suspect #1 grabbed the handle of the machete and partially pulled the weapon [a few inches] from a brown leather sheath attached to the suspect's waist.

Mr. ██████████ was alarmed when Suspect #1 threatened "I'm going to burn this mother down!" Mr. ██████████ explained Suspect #1 aggressively postured himself within 1' in front of ██████████ in order to intimidate. Mr. ██████████ reflected "I was terrified!" He stated that Suspect #1 followed ██████████ and him to the front of the business along S. Nevada Ave.

OFFICER STATEMENT (CONTINUED):

I attempted to un-handcuff Mr. Thompson seated in my vehicle. Mr. Thompson remained vehement and he remained handcuffed for officer safety. Sgt. Chaney confirmed there would be no criminal charges cited at this time. I re-engaged Mr. Thompson and removed his handcuffs. I allowed Mr. Thompson to exit from my vehicle after the ██████████ were given time to get away from the immediate area. Mr. ██████████ remained confrontational.

INITIAL INFORMATION

On 10-13-16, at approximately 1827 hours, Officers Balka, 3167; Frabbiele, 4639; Speight, 3344; Walker, 5733; and I, Officer Woodworth, 2851 were dispatched to **1207 S. Nevada Ave., Discount Exhaust Works** in reference to a reported disturbance. Initial information from Dispatch was that a male was outside of this location with a machete and was not allowing staff to leave. This male was described as a black male, in his late 20s, approximately 6', tall, with black hair, and a beard, wearing a red sweatshirt hoodie and blue jeans, and had a second party of a white male, 18-19 years old, 5'8", thin build, brown hair, with a white shirt and red pants.

OFFICER STATEMENT

Due to the report of a weapon being involved, officers responded to the scene utilizing emergency lights and sirens.

Upon my arrival at approximately 1833 hours, I pulled in front of the business and observed what appeared to be four males located on the south side of the business, which has an alley running from S. Nevada Ave., which is along the front side of the business, along the south side to a back parking lot leading to Weber St.

As I got out, I gave all four males commands to get down on the ground. Three of the males, two of which were identified as the reporting party, immediately got down on the ground. I observed a male matching the description of the party supposed to have the machete; a black male, wearing a red and gray hoodie, was not complying with officer's commands to get down and began walking away. I approached this male with my handgun drawn and gave the male commands to get down onto the ground. The male did not have any items in his hands and initially sat down on a small metal trailer next to the business. I contacted this male, grabbing him by the

left arm and pulling him from a seated position onto the ground and placing him into handcuffs. The male was verbally aggressive, and continued advising we were just arresting him because he was black. This male was later identified as **DORIUN THOMPSON** [REDACTED]

The other males contacted were the reporting party **ALEXANDER** [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] **JIMMY** [REDACTED], and the third male was the other party involved wearing the white shirt and was identified as **NOAH MCCULLEY** [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] immediately advised that Mr. Thompson was the one who initially had the machete, but officers checked and it was not currently in his possession. The [REDACTED] advised that Mr. Thompson had walked down the alley to the east of them where another group of people were that were involved with Mr. Thompson and who had insulted them.

I responded down the alley and observed a white sedan parked down the alley in front of the old **KOA Campground** located at **1209 S. Nevada Ave.** Here I contacted **NATASHA HARVEY** [REDACTED] and **ANDI VAN GOGH** [REDACTED]. Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey advised they were moving property to the back of the KOA Campground and had received permission from Lt. Jensen from the Colorado Springs Police Department Gold Hill Division that they were allowed to park at this location and move property to the very back of the KOA Campground, where there was a small area designated that would not be constituted as trespassing.

Ms. Gogh stated they were sitting next to her vehicle, the white sedan, when two Budget trucks pulled up and Alexander and Jimmy [REDACTED] exited the vehicles and told them they were not allowed to park at this location, or move their property at that location due to it being their property and that they were trespassing. Ms. Gogh stated she had received permission to be at that location and believed this was an alley owned by the city. Ms. Gogh stated Jimmy [REDACTED] was verbally aggressive and appeared to believe they were homeless and having an issue with them.

Ms. Gogh stated at this time the [REDACTED] began taking their property which was in front of their car and throwing it into the KOA Campground, which led to them arguing with Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey. Ms. Gogh stated at

this time the [REDACTED] began pushing both her and Ms. Harvey, shoving her and Ms. Gogh into the vehicle and shoving Ms. Harvey down to the ground, causing her to hurt her knee.

I asked Ms. Gogh who was involved that had a machete. Ms. Gogh stated she did not see anybody with a knife or machete, but stated there was a knife in a box nearby just inside the KOA Campground area. Officer Walker responded over to the box and stated there was a small machete inside the box. Officer Walker and Officer Speight stayed in contact with Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey to obtain further statement.

I responded over taking photographs of the box, which I observed to be a light colored overturned doghouse which had a Camillus Carnivore X black sheath with brown handle, approximately one foot long machete. After taking photographs of this, I collected it and responded to the trunk of my marked patrol vehicle; securing it in my marked patrol vehicle.

I then contacted Jimmy [REDACTED] and obtained his statement.

JIMMY [REDACTED] STATEMENT

Jimmy [REDACTED] stated he owns the business, Discount Exhaust Works, and parks his Budget Rental trucks in the back lot and has had several issues with people trespassing on his property and also with stealing vehicles and other material from the business. Mr. [REDACTED] stated as he parked his truck with [REDACTED] Alexander in the back of the business located along the east side of the business, he observed a white sedan with two females parked on the alley, which is his personal property.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated he told the females that they were trespassing and needed to move their property, but that the females became very rude and stated they were allowed to be there. Mr. [REDACTED] stated him and his son, due to the females not moving it, grabbed their property and began sliding it off their property towards the KOA Campground, when Ms. Harvey jumped on his, Jimmy's back, and began hitting him. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he did not have any injuries, but that [REDACTED] Alex had to pull Ms. Harvey off, and as he pulled her off she fell to the ground in the paved alley.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated at this time two males, later identified as Mr. Thompson and Mr. McCulley, exited from the trees of the KOA Campground and he observed that Mr. Thompson had on the right side of his pants a black sheath with what appeared to be a machete. Mr. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Thompson was patting the handle to the machete and stated something to the effect of I know you're not hitting these white girls.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated him and his son began backing up and Mr. Thompson began yelling that he was going to own their business and being belligerent. Mr. Thompson stated he was not able to understand all of what Mr. Thompson was saying, advising he was sometimes rambling, but they backed up and went into their business to call 911 until officers arrived, when they exited. Believing that Mr. Thompson and Mr. McCulley had walked down the alley, but had returned just as officers were arriving.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Thompson never removed the machete from the sheath and never made threats to harm him or his son, but was being belligerent and just making general threats regarding their business. Mr. Thompson stated he did feel in fear for his life during the altercation.

OFFICER STATEMENT CONTINUED

I then contacted Officer Balka, who was speaking with Alexander [REDACTED]. Officer Balka advised Alexander had stated they were telling the two females they were on private property and that they began moving the property by sliding it off of their alley when the heavier set female, identified as Ms. Harvey, jumped on his father's back and began hitting him. Alexander advised he had to pull the female off, which caused her to fall to the ground. Alexander advised this is when they were confronted by Mr. Thompson and Mr. McCulley and that Mr. Thompson was very close to him; almost face-to-face and made the statement, "I know you're not hitting these white women."

Alexander advised he observed a machete in a sheath on Mr. Thompson's pants and he grabbed the handle and was slightly exposing the blade portion of the machete and began stating he was going to burn the business down and

there would be no more business for them. Officer Balka advised that Alexander did feel threatened for his safety at this time.

I re-contacted Alexander just to clarify some of his statement. I asked Alexander where he was at when confronted by Mr. Thompson. Alexander advised they were next to the females' vehicle by the KOA Campground when confronted by Mr. Thompson. I asked if at any time was the machete removed from the sheath and Alexander stated Mr. Thompson was showing the blade of the machete, but never physically removed it from the sheath while pointing it at them. Alexander stated threats were never made to harm him or his father directly, but that threats were made towards the business.

I asked Alexander if at any time could the machete have been removed and him or his father been struck with it, or been physically struck by Mr. Thompson and Mr. McCulley, and he advised yes, there were several opportunities for them to be struck, and that the two males continued following Alexander and his father as they walked back up the alley towards their business, and that Mr. Thompson was being belligerent and at times rambling and hard to understand.

Officer Balka initially contacted Mr. Thompson, who was uncooperative with officers and racially volatile and advised Mr. Thompson did not provide details relating to the incident.

I then contacted Officer Frabbiele, who was in contact with Mr. McCulley. Officer Frabbiele advised that Mr. McCulley had heard the disturbance and observed the [REDACTED] and the females physically engaged when him and Mr. Thompson responded over believing that the females may be in distress, which is when they came in contact with the [REDACTED]. Officer Frabbiele advised Mr. McCulley would not go into detail on the observations of the disturbance or the interaction between them and the [REDACTED] continually saying that he was innocent.

I observed that there were signs for 24 hour surveillance and no trespassing on the business and gated fence to the back of the business, but no signs near where Ms. Gogh or Ms. Harvey were parked. I asked Alexander if they had video surveillance of the alley, and he advised they

do not actually have video surveillance, they just have fake cameras to try to scare people away. They used to have actual cameras, but they were continually getting broken by people in the alley trespassing in the alley.

No independent witnesses to the disturbance was located.

EVIDENCE

I collected the Camillus Carnivore X, approximately one foot machete with brown handle and black sheath, photographs and placed them into evidence at the Gold Hill Substation.

STATUS OF PATROL INVESTIGATION

Due to the lack of no trespassing signs at the specific location where Ms. Gogh and Ms. Harvey were at and both sides have different stories with no independent witness, no charges were filed at this time pending further review.

Sgt. Chaney, 142 was on scene and notified of the investigation.

INITIAL INFORMATION

On 10-13-16, at approximately 1828 hours, I, Officer T. Speight, 3344, was dispatched to **1207 S. Nevada Ave., Discount Exhaust Works** to investigate a reported disturbance. Initial information from Dispatch stated there were several males and females arguing and physically fighting in the parking lot to the south of the above address. The call screen notes also said that one of the males had a machete and was holding two or three people at machete point.

Upon arrival, I saw several officers in front of 1207 S. Nevada Ave with three males detained. I was asked by the primary officer, Officer Woodworth, to contact two females who reported they had been assaulted near the old **KOA Camp** approximately two to three hundred feet south of the exhaust company. I made contact with two females who were identified as Party #1, **NATASHA MARIE HARVEY** [REDACTED] and Party #2, **ANDI VAN GOGH** [REDACTED]

PARTY #1 STATEMENT

Natasha stated earlier in the day on 10-13-16, she had been told to leave a transient camp where she had been living, which was near the homeless shelter on Las Vegas St. Natasha told me she was being helped by Ms. Van Gogh in order to relocate to the old KOA campground located near **1209 S. Nevada Ave.** Natasha said she arrived at the S. Nevada Ave address at approximately 5:30 or 6:00 PM, and unloaded her property out of Andi Van Gogh's vehicle. Natasha said she placed her property in the grassy area near an entrance into the KOA camp.

Natasha said eventually two males approached them, and told them they were on private property and to get out. Natasha said she tried to talk with the two males in order to explain what they were doing. She tried to tell the two males that she was just trying to get to the old KOA camp where she

was going to pitch a tent and stay until she could find other arrangements. Natasha said after two or three minutes of arguing, the male parties began picking her property up and throwing them onto the roadway away from where they had stacked it.

Natasha said at some point, she was not sure how exactly, but the verbal argument became physical and the four of them were pushing and shoving each other in the roadway. Natasha said one of the males attempted to pick her up and then pushed her to the ground in the roadway. Natasha said she did not realize the property was posted as no trespassing and believed that the access was public to the old KOA camp.

PARTY #2 STATEMENT

Andi told me she works for an organization that assisted homeless people in the city of Colorado Springs. She said when the homeless camp was torn down near the homeless shelter on Las Vegas, she began helping Natasha find a new place to stay until she could find a permanent residence. Andi said she was told by different officers that the displaced homeless citizens could relocate to the old KOA camp south of Nevada Ave. in the 1200 block.

Andi said she drove on a roadway she believed to be a public street, dropped off Natasha's property, and was waiting in the area for a second homeless person to show up. She was going to assist both of them in relocating to the old KOA camp. Andi said at some point, at approximately 6 to 6:15 p.m., two males approached her and Natasha and told them that they were on private property and to get off. Andi said the two males were rude and were telling them that they needed to leave right away. Andi said she tried to explain to the two males that the homeless people, especially Natasha, was trying to get through to the old KOA camp and they were causing no issues.

Andi said at some point the two males attempted to pick their property up and throw it into the roadway. Andi said she and Natasha stepped them, and told them to stop touching their property. Andi said at some point the verbal argument turned into a physical argument and the two males started to push and shove her and Natasha into the roadway.

Andi told me that during the physical fight; two or three males walked up the path towards them, and started to yell at the two males. Andi said these parties; one black male and two white males, in their defense, stepped in and pushed the two males away from them. Andi said at some point the black male had a machete in his hand; however, it was still in a sheath and never raised towards anyone.

During the physical fight, Andi said she hurt a finger on her right hand and that Natasha had a scrape to her knee.

I asked Andi and Natasha if there was anything further to add. They said no.

OFFICER STATEMENT

The area where Andi and Natasha were attempting to cut through to go to the KOA camp was clearly posted with a no trespassing sign approximately ten feet from where they had unloaded their property.

NARRATIVE

INITIATING INFORMATION:

On 10-13-16 at approximately 1833 hours, I, **Sergeant Olav G. Chaney (142, 2P17)**, was dispatched to 1207 South Nevada Avenue, Discount Exhaust Works, regarding a disturbance involving a knife. I responded Code 3 (flashing lights and siren) due to the report of a knife being involved. I arrived on scene at approximately 1837 hours and contacted **Officer Wes Woodworth (2851)**. Officer Woodworth advised officers had multiple individuals detained as officers were investigating the disturbance.

OFFICER'S STATEMENT:

I was advised two females with a vehicle were caught trespassing on the business property setting up to camp out for the night, by the male owner and his son. Further information received indicated two other males became involved to assist the females and there may have been some pushing and shoving between the groups. There were no independent witnesses located. It was also determined a knife was never pulled, although one was located.

The initial issue was the trespassing by the females. The females believed they were on a public roadway and not trespassing on private property. The roadway in question is an access road that goes between South Weber Street and South Nevada Avenue. The business owner advised that the access road between South Weber Street and South Nevada Avenue is actually their property. There are no signs to indicate that the access road is private property and it would be reasonable for anyone to assume the road is a public road.

It is also understandable why the owner and his son were moving the female's property off of their roadway. The females indicated they were also pushed by the owner and his son; however the owner's son advised he did grab and push away one of the females after she jumped on his dad, protecting his dad. The other two males, one with a large knife in a sheath on his belt, stated they got involved when they saw the owner and the owner's son putting their hands on the females, believing they were coming to the rescue of the females. This would also be a reasonable reaction. Both sides advised the knife was never pulled out of it's sheath, although it may have been slightly lifted from the sheath per the owner's son. There were no reported threats regarding the knife.

I informed both sides of the disturbance that there would be no

arrests made at this time without an independent witness. I informed officers to complete a case report regarding the incident and to retrieve the knife for evidence pending a potential review by the DA's Office.

I advised the owners of the property that they might consider putting up no trespassing and no parking signs for the roadway access to make it clear to anyone that the roadway is not a thoroughfare and that it is private property. I instructed the females and the two males that came to their assistance, that they were trespassing and that the old KOA Campgrounds, to the south of the business is also a no trespassing area.
