



2023 Listening Tour with Mayor Yemi & City Council District 5 Feedback Summary Report

Overview: This report provides a summary of all of the feedback captured at the District 5 Listening Session with Councilmembers Nancy Henjum (District 5), David Leinweber (At-Large), and Brian Risley (At-Large) at COS City Hub on Aug. 11, 2023. Feedback received from this session does not necessarily reflect feedback solely from residents who live in District 5.

Summary:

Public Safety & Homelessness:

Police response times and the need to solve homelessness and related issues were nearly universally mentioned by citizens. Requests to better enforce existing laws around panhandling, camping, graffiti, and other related issues were also prevalent, particularly in the City's parks and green spaces. While many voiced support for the plan for a new police academy, more officers, and higher salaries to retain officers, several also voiced the need for better anti-bias and mental health training to ensure fewer police abuses and lawsuits. Many other site-specific and neighborhood-specific issues were raised; see full notes for details.

Traffic-related safety issues were frequently raised, with many complaining that street racing, loud mufflers (noise violations), and red-light running is not being enforced.

The Fire Department was complimented on their services multiple times, and the city's FireWise and fire mitigation plans were well-liked.

Infrastructure & Utilities:

One of the biggest complaints was that the City is not doing enough to develop and maintain safe, accessible sidewalks and streetscapes/curbs. The need for more and better public transportation and multi-modal transportation options was also frequently raised, and other associated items like the need for electric buses and specific routes to better serve seniors and the military bases were also mentioned. Citizens seemed to appreciate the free bus transportation offerings during the summer—and wanted that to continue beyond the summer.

Regarding the City's road networks, the need to better maintain roadways and fix potholes was voiced several times. Many feel that the City could do a better job of utilizing 'smart city' tech to deal with traffic, stoplights, and other issues. Problems with East-West transit corridors (and lack thereof) were mentioned frequently, as was the need for more bike lanes.

Many mentioned the importance of transitioning to sustainable energy solutions, including renewable energy production and water conservation. This topic also came up in the housing and development category, with citizens suggesting that developers should be incentivized to build greener and/or carbon

neutral homes and include solar. Compliments were given to the City's drinking water system; stormwater was raised as a continuing issue to be addressed in certain areas.

Economy:

Citizens voiced support for the retention of Space Command and the city's military community, while sharing concerns that perhaps the City is overly reliant on the military and Department of Defense for economic growth. Several suggested that the City focus more on recruiting non-military / Department of Defense jobs, including consulting, management, and finance.

The City's support for tourism was appreciated, although some suggested the City could do more to boost tourism, specifically eco-tourism. More people complimented or expressed support for 'Olympic City' branding than detracted from it.

Several suggested that retaining employees and talent are problems for the City's business community, with citizens suggesting that boosting development Downtown instead of in the suburbs could help attract more younger employees with more nightlife and culture and reduce 'brain drain.'

Housing / Development:

The lack of affordable housing was a top concern for nearly all participants. There were mixed opinions on how to address the issue – many expressed support for truly affordable housing, including specific accolades to projects like LaunchPad and Artspace, while others suggested that the city needs fewer apartment communities and more 'middle housing'; townhomes, condos, etc., were provided as examples. Support for getting rid of legislation that restricted condo development (construction defect laws) was also mentioned, as was restricting AirBnBs / short-term rentals.

Support for density was expressed ('build up, not out'), as was the need for more green spaces and developer funding for parks, infrastructure, 'green construction', and other amenities.

City Governance / Administration:

Many expressed support for the GoCOS app and the City's Code Enforcement division, but citizens felt that City Planning was not transparent enough and felt a lack of trust in that department. The city's website interface and user experience was criticized more than once as being difficult to navigate and looking outdated.

Several supported providing a salary to City Council to allow more people to run for office, and several voiced concerns that Council was too friendly to developers.

Support for higher taxes and/or better funding for the city was raised several times, with citizens suggesting that an over-reliance on sales tax was a problem, as was TABOR.

Schools / Education:

The lack of affordable childcare services in COS was mentioned a few times, with some suggesting that childcare be subsidized. Many support trade schools and more education in public schools for trade employment, and some suggested that the military and Department of Defense community could become more involved in schools to help encourage or train students to want to pursue jobs in that sector.

The importance of diversity in education and education leadership was raised, and several expressed support for the Pikes Peak Library District. Workforce housing for teachers was requested.

Other Topics:

A range of other commentary was provided, from citizens expressing concerns or dislike of metro districts and airport noise to requests for a 'tax free day' and better senior services / age-in-place support services.

Topic: Public Safety & Homelessness

- What is being done to address homelessness and drugs / root causes of homelessness?*****

- Diversion services needed for those coming out of prison.
- Need supervised drug use site to prevent overdose and prevent usage in public.
- City needs to enforce loud mufflers for noise.
- Afraid to go to the Citadel Mall.
- No control of guns dangerous for public and for police.

- Fix the east/west corridor issue.****
- Platte and Boulder not enough for east-west travel.
- Need public restrooms, perhaps even public showers.
- Don't make Platte and Boulder one-way streets.
- Sidewalks need to be fixed and maintained; better ADA access needed.*******
- Potholes need to be fixed, better road maintenance.**
- Yampa, Cache la Poudre, and Hancock have stormwater drainage problems.

- Hancock bus #12 route seems to strand people and senior citizens.
- More handicapped parking is needed downtown Colorado Springs.
- Is bus system still going to serve Hancock & Golf Acres after work is done at Golf Acres office park?
- Trails north of Uintah are nice.
- Upgrades needed to Monument Valley Park (to boost economy?).

- Parking meters are good Downtown but shouldn't be used outside of downtown Colorado Springs.
- Parking meters charge too much and ending at 10pm is 'too late.'
- Expanding too much out east for water to keep up not sustainable.
- City needs to do more to maintain city trees.
- Need municipal-run trash and recycling, too many different companies, tearing up streets and alleys, need zero-waste and composting centers.****
- 'Does the city have plans to recycle water?'
- Build a riverwalk (COS Creek Plan).**
- Support sustainable energy / utilities, more solar.***
- Need more sustainable / electric buses.*
- Do more for 'climate resiliency' more trees and shade, use grey water to irrigate.
- Drake closed too soon.
- Need more park inter-connectivity, transportation via greenways.
